SUBJECT: WITHHOLDING PROPRIETARY INFORMATION FROM PUBLIC DISCLOSURE
OF PRESENTATION MATERIALS FOR NUSCALE'S AUGUST 21 AND 22,
2013 MEETINGS (NRC PROJECT NO. 0769)

Dear Mr. Wallace:

By letter dated August 1, 2013, NuScale Power, LLC. (NSP) submitted an affidavit (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML13217A165), in which you requested that the subject slide presentations be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR), Part 2, Section 2.390:

Steam and Power Conversion Chapter 10 (ADAMS Accession No. ML13217A179 and ML13217A167)

Auxiliary Systems Chapter 9 (ADAMS Accession No. ML13217A176 and ML13217A177)

A nonproprietary copy of these documents have been placed in the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Public Document Room and added to the NRC Library in ADAMS, with Accession Numbers as follows:

Steam and Power Conversion Chapter 10 (ADAMS Accession No. ML13217A174 and ML13217A175)

Auxiliary Systems Chapter 9 (ADAMS Accession No. ML13217A172 and ML13217A173)

The affidavit stated that the submitted information should be considered exempt from mandatory public disclosure for the following reasons:

(a) The presentations disclose information about the methods and processes by which NuScale has designed its auxiliary and steam and power conversion structures, systems, and components. NuScale has performed significant research and evaluation to develop a basis for these designs and has invested significant human and financial resources in such development.

(b) NuScale's unique auxiliary and steam and power conversion systems designs and schedule provide NuScale with a competitive economic advantage over other companies. Public disclosure of the information would cause substantial harm to NuScale's competitive position and reduce or foreclose opportunities for NuScale to generate a return on its investment in research and development. Although the exact financial value of the information is difficult to quantify, the auxiliary and steam and power conversion designs are key elements of the design basis for a NuScale plant and, therefore, have substantial value to NuScale.

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(c) If the information were disclosed to the public, NuScale's competitors would have access to the information without having been required to undertake a similar expenditure of resources. Such disclosure would constitute a misappropriation of NuScale's intellectual property, would unfairly provide NuScale's competitors with a windfall and would deprive NuScale of the opportunity to seek an adequate return on its investment.

We have reviewed your application and the material in accordance with the requirements of 10 CFR 2.390 and, on the basis of the statements in the affidavit, have determined that the submitted information sought to be withheld contains proprietary commercial information and should be withheld from public disclosure.

Therefore, the version(s) of the submitted information marked as proprietary will be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 CFR 2.390(b)(5) and Section 103(b) of the Atomic Energy Act of 1954, as amended.

Withholding from public inspection shall not affect the right, if any, of persons properly and directly concerned to inspect the documents. If the need arises, we may send copies of this information to our consultants working in this area. We will, of course, ensure that the consultants have signed the appropriate agreements for handling proprietary information.

If the basis for withholding this information from public inspection should change in the future such that the information could then be made available for public inspection, you should promptly notify the NRC. You also should understand that the NRC may have cause to review this determination in the future, for example, if the scope of a Freedom of Information Act request includes your information. In all review situations, if the NRC makes a determination adverse to the above, you will be notified in advance of any public disclosure.
