Dear Dr. D'Souza,

In order to continue our review of your amendment request dated June 27, 2013, we need the following additional information:

1. Your request states that Heart Specialists, PC of Southern Connecticut will be dissolved and acquired by PriMed, LLC. Please clarify if there has been a change or transfer of control.

With regards to changes of control (transferor and/or transferee, as appropriate):

- a. Provide a complete description of the transaction (transfer of stocks or assets, or merger). Indicate whether the name has changed and include the new name. Include the name and telephone number of a licensee contact who NRC may contact if more information is needed.
- b. Describe any changes in personnel or duties that relate to the licensed program. Include training and experience for new personnel.
- c. Describe any changes in the organization, location, facilities, equipment or procedures that relate to the licensed program.
- d. Describe the status of the surveillance program (surveys, wipe tests, quality control) at the present time and the expected status at the time that control is to be transferred.
- e. Confirm that all records concerning the safe and effective decommissioning of the facility will be transferred to the transferee or to NRC, as appropriate. These records include documentation of surveys of ambient radiation levels and fixed and/or removable contamination, including methods and sensitivity.
- f. Confirm that the transferee will abide by all constraints, conditions, requirements and commitments of the transferor or that the transferee will submit a complete description of the proposed licensed program.

Submit the above requested information signed by senior management from both Heart Specialists, PC of Southern Connecticut and PriMed, LLC.

2. Your request states that you wish to change your licensee name to "PriMed, LLC". It appears that PriMed, LLC merged with another NRC licensee, Connecticut Heart and Vascular Center, PC, and have sent in an amendment request to change the name on their license to "PriMed, LLC" as well. They also indicated the possibility of merging into one license. Please note that your license name will be listed as PriMed LLC, d/b/a Heart Specialists, PC of Southern Connecticut. Alternatively, if you both wish to operate under a single license with multiple locations of use, please send an amendment request to terminate one of the two licenses.
3. Please confirm that PriMed, LLC does not perform any activities that fall under any other active

NRC licenses.

4. Please confirm that you want to keep the mailing address that is currently listed on your license as Four Corporate Drive, Suite 100, Shelton 06484. Otherwise, provide a current mailing address that you would like listed on your license.
5. In order to facilitate future communications, please provide a current contact e-mail address, telephone, and fax number for you and your senior management representative that can be made public.
