SUBJECT: ACCEPTANCE REVIEW OF SOUTH CAROLINA ELECTRIC & GAS COMPANY'S  
REQUEST FOR LICENSE AMENDMENT (LAR 13-32) AND EXEMPTION FOR  
THE VIRGIL C. SUMMER NUCLEAR STATION UNITS 2 AND 3: LIQUID  
RADWASTE SYSTEM CONSISTENCY CHANGES (RQ0405)

Dear Mr. Jones:

By letter dated August 30, 2013 (Agencywide Documents Access and Management System (ADAMS) Accession No. ML13246A228), South Carolina Electric & Gas Company (SCE&G) submitted a request for a license amendment and an exemption for the Virgil C. Summer Nuclear Station (VCSNS) Units 2 and 3. The proposed license amendment request would depart from the plant-specific Design Control Document (DCD) Tier 1 Combined License Appendix C information and Tier 2 material by revising the safety function and classification of the Liquid Radwaste System (WLS) drain hubs in the Chemical and Volume Control System and Passive Core Cooling System (PXS) compartments. In addition, the proposed changes would modify the PXS compartment drain piping connection; WLS valve types, and depiction of components in the WLS figures.

SCE&G has also requested an exemption from the provisions of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR) Part 52, Appendix D, Section III.B, "Design Certification Rule for the AP1000 Design, Scope and Contents," to allow a departure from the elements of the certification information in Tier 1 of the generic DCD.

The purpose of this letter is to provide the results of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff's acceptance review of these requests. The acceptance review was performed to determine if there is sufficient technical information in scope and depth to allow the NRC staff to complete its detailed technical reviews. The acceptance review is also intended to identify whether the application has any readily apparent information insufficiencies in its characterization of the regulatory requirements or the licensing basis of the plant.

Consistent with Section 50.90 of the 10 CFR, an amendment to the license must fully describe the changes requested, and follow as far as applicable, the form prescribed for original applications. Section 52.79 of the 10 CFR addresses content of technical information required. This section stipulates that the submittal address the design and operating characteristics, unusual or novel design features, and principal safety considerations.
