Dear Dr. Brown:

Enclosed is Amendment No. 72 to your NRC Material License No. 21-04072-01 in accordance with your request. We have also removed Condition 13, as it no longer applies to your license. Note that the changes made to your license are printed in **bold** font.

We have noted that the letter dated June 25, 2013, included a request to remove the cardiology camera room from your license. The NRC staff has reviewed final status surveys for this area of use located at the 6245 Inkster Road location of use. Based on its review, the staff has concluded that the referenced cardiology camera room area of use is suitable for unrestricted use.

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region III office at (630) 829-9887 so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

You will be periodically inspected by NRC. Failure to conduct your program in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, or imposition of a civil penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license as specified in the General Statement of Policy and Procedure for NRC Enforcement Actions. Since serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements, prompt and vigorous enforcement action will be taken when dealing with licensees who do not achieve the necessary meticulous attention to detail and the high standard of compliance which NRC expects of its licensees.

The NRC's Safety Culture Policy Statement became effective in June 2011. While a policy statement and not a regulation, it sets forth the agency's *expectations* for individuals and organizations to establish and maintain a positive safety culture.
