Thank you for the revised attachments. I have only one remaining concern regarding Attachment IV. It fails to specify the minimum qualifications for the RSO. I acknowledge that your current RSO, Mr. Farina, is well qualified for the position. However, to make a finding that your program ensures that workers are trained and qualified for the activities authorized in the license, I need a commitment to the minimum training and experience any future RSO will be required to possess.

I note that the activities under License SNM-1373 are not as complex as activities authorized under your other licenses. The minimum qualifications for an RSO under this license may differ from the minimum qualifications for reactor operations or research with dispersible materials. I have no wish to create conflicts between this license application and commitments under your other licenses.
