RE: Affidavit to withhold information from public under 10CFR§2.390

SAIC is requesting that appropriate portions marked as "Withhold from public disclosure under 10CFR§2.390 for Law Enforcement and company confidential purposes" of the referenced RAI response be withheld from public information. The reason for withholding this information is:

- The device is used by local, state, and federal law enforcement agencies. The targeted users of this device include various local police and drug interdiction departments, Drug Enforcement Agency (DEA), State Police Departments, and Dept. Homeland Security, U.S Customs and Border Protection. The Xpose device is designed to help these agencies to non-destructively search for hidden compartments or density changes in vehicles and cargo containers. SAIC believes it is imperative that this information be withheld under 10CFR§2.390(a)(7)(v) from public view. If disclosed to the public, this information would disclose tools, techniques, and procedures used by law enforcement that would allow circumvention of the law by drug cartels and other organized crime syndicates that traffic in these types of illegal activities.
- The information contains company confidential trade secrets for the manufacturing and design of the Xpose device. (withheld under 10CFR§2.390(a)(4)). Disclosure of this information would allow uncontrolled production and distribution of this device which would compromise the product value to law enforcement and hence SAIC investment.
