Dr. Jankovich,

Thank you for your time today. I am going to copy and paste the questions from the document you and I discussed. I will use red text for my answers.

13.4 TRANSFERS TO INACTIVE STATUS

If a registration certificate holder requests that a registration certificate be transferred to inactive status,⁸ the registration certificate holder should provide:

_ the total number of the products sold; the number of products still in use;⁹

From the time that USON was responsible for this product we sold a total of 129 units. There is no way that we would know how many of these units are still active.

_ the services (including source replacement and availability) the registration certificate holder will still provide to users of the product or the identification of an entity that will provide services;

USON has sent a letter to all customers that have purchased the Q200 and told them we will no longer repair or calibrate Q200 testers after July 31, 2013. The customers may send their testers to USON United Kingdom.

_ a commitment that the registration certificate holder will no longer commercially distribute the product; and

USON will no longer possess, distribute, repair or calibrate the Q200 after September 30, 2013.

_ verification that no changes were made to the product since its initial registration or last amendment. If changes have been made, then the new information must be incorporated into the inactivated certificate. However, the changes need not be in a bold typeface because the certificate has a new registration number assigned to it.

Since USON purchased Qualitek in 2002 there have no changes to the Q200 tester
