

We hope that this letter finds you well. Thank you for considering Georgia WAND and our requests in the past, and we hope you are able to support us with this need as well.

RE: TIME-SENSITIVE -- assistance in getting NRC to hold waste confidence meeting in Atlanta

We write to ask your assistance in getting the Nuclear Regulatory Commission to hold one of its upcoming waste confidence hearings in Atlanta in late September/early October.

Since the courts ruled a little more than a year ago that NRC had not satisfactorily studied the issue of radioactive waste storage at reactor sites sufficiently to make a reliable and competent statement that onsite waste storage could be deemed "safe" final disposal, the NRC has been prohibited from issuing new reactor licenses and granting license extensions to existing reactors. Until the waste confidence rule is rewritten to meet the court standards, this condition will persist.

To satisfy the court's ruling, NRC embarked on a process, which is now reaching its culmination in a series of public hearings around the U.S. to obtain public input on this issue. To our outrage, NRC has not scheduled a meeting in the state with that is currently home to two of the country's first new nuclear reactors (Plant Vogtle) in 30 years. Meetings being held in the southeast will be in Charlotte, NC and Orlando, FL. not Atlanta.


