Executive Summary

- ► AREVA is restructuring project activities to focus on FSAR chapter closure.
- ► FSAR chapters are prioritized based on readiness for completion. AREVA's goal is to close FSAR chapters and support NRC chapter review completion as early as possible while retaining a focus on the longer-term technical challenges to design certification.
- ► Closure plan meetings will establish a common agreement on remaining activities to close FSAR chapters. Results of these meetings and subsequent schedule discussions will be documented in closure plan letters that will govern project execution.



Executive Summary

- FSAR chapter groupings (prioritization)
 - Group A Chapters with few or no open items
 - Group B Chapters with open items but generally well understood paths forward, moderate level of effort
 - Group C Last chapters to close due to technical challenges or dependencies on Group C chapters
- ► AREVA is establishing a design and FSAR freeze process based on industry precedent to enforce chapter closure and to manage emergent issues
- ► AREVA and UniStar are investigating opportunities to integrate schedules to improve efficiency



FSAR Closure Process

Chapter closure planning

- AREVA and NRC to identify and concur on activities required for closure
- Establish integrated schedule for chapter progression through ACRS and beyond
- Document mutually established schedule in closure plan letters
- Review closure plans monthly with NRC project management to align expectations and manage emergent issues
- ► Key elements of chapter closure process
 - Pre-closure activities
 - Systematic closure readiness reviews
 - All known FSAR changes have been incorporated
 - Chapter RAIs are closed. RAIs supporting conclusions in the draft SER will be reconciled if necessary.
 - Design basis information supporting FSAR chapter is properly identified and complete



FSAR Closure Process

Pre-closure activities (continued)

- Chapter freeze point established formal change evaluation process gives NRC confidence to finalize SER
- Final revisions to material incorporated by reference
- Options for FSAR chapter revisions
 - Full FSAR revision
 - FSAR revision incorporating final changes associated with specific chapters
 - Chapter submittal

Post-closure activities

- Evaluation, tracking, and reporting of changes identified after freeze point
 - Process based on DC/COL-ISG-011 and lessons learned from industry precedent
 - Objective criteria will determine whether change is to be incorporated into DC
 - Potential changes could result from NRC reviews of remaining chapters, emergent safety issues, or corrective actions
- Changes that meet criteria for notification will be promptly communicated to NRC to minimize impact on review schedule



FSAR Chapter Prioritization

- Chapters grouped based on readiness for closure
- Group A
 - Closure plan meeting will identify all anticipated changes to final FSAR chapter
 - FSAR Chapters
 - Chapter 2 Site Characteristics
 - Chapter 5 Reactor Coolant System and Connected Systems
 - Chapter 8 Electric Power
 - Chapter 10 Steam and Power Conversion System
 - Chapter 13 Conduct of Operations
 - Chapter 17 Quality Assurance
- Groups B and C
 - Initial closure plan meetings will develop schedule for remaining RAIs, technical issue resolution, audits, and significant FSAR changes.



Chapter 2 – Site Characteristics

- No key technical issues exist for Chapter 2
- Chapter 2 open RAIs
 - ♦ RAI 541 Question 02-3 Final response submitted 9/5/2013 to address hurricane winds and missiles per RG1.221
 - NRC Status: In Evaluation (based on eRAI report dated 9/24/2013)
 - RAI 274 Q02-1 and RAI 288 Q02-2
 - NRC Status: Confirmatory Action. AREVA believes these RAIs are closed. FSAR changes were incorporated into FSAR Rev. 2.
- Other pending FSAR changes
 - ◆ COL Information Item 2.5-5 "demonstrate that no capable faults exist at the site..."
 - NRC recommends "potential for surface deformation" to align with draft SRP public telecon 10/7/13
 - AREVA plans to use NRC-recommended wording
 - Potential impact as a result of ongoing COL Information Item revisions on R-COLA project

 - Respond to NRC request on COL Information Item 2.5-5
 - Submit final FSAR Chapter 2 after closure readiness review

 - Status RAI 274 Q02-1 and RAI 288 Q02-2 as closed
 - Complete R-COLA review of COL Information Item wording that impacts Group A chapters
 - Complete SER and schedule ACRS meeting

Chapter 10 – Steam and Power Conversion System

- Key technical issues
 - Ongoing Fukushima review has the potential to impact Chapter 10
- Chapter 10 open RAIs
 - ◆ RAI 605 Question 10.04.09-14 deals with potential for water hammer from fire protection system to EFW (ELAP event mitigation)
 - NRC Status: Issued / Waiting for Response
 - AREVA will evaluate the current EFW piping analysis. If it is not bounding, further analysis will be performed to confirm the acceptability of injecting fire water into the EFW system.
- Other pending FSAR changes
 - Design change related to MFW flow control in accident analyses (ATWS analysis and FSAR Rev. 5 meeting Action #18)
 - FSAR Rev. 5 Action #10: SGBD classification in evaluation
 - FSAR Rev 5 Action Item #19: Superseded by RAI 605
 - Minor impacts from consistency reviews



Chapter 10 – Steam and Power Conversion System

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- Audits, inspections, or public meetings required for Phase 4
 - None
- Actions to achieve closure
 - AREVA
 - Respond to RAI 605 and FSAR Rev 5 action items
 - Submit final FSAR Chapter 10 after closure readiness review
 - NRC
 - Issue RAI 605
 - Complete SER and schedule ACRS meeting
- Duration for remaining actions



Chapter 5 – Reactor Coolant System and Connected Systems

- ► No key technical issues exist for Chapter 5
- ► Chapter 5 open RAIs
 - ◆ RAI 560 Question 05.02.01.01-7 Justification for Code Case N-782
 - NRC Status: Confirmatory action. AREVA believes this RAI is closed. Final response submitted 11/1/2012 and changes incorporated into FSAR Rev. 5.
- Other pending FSAR changes
 - Minor change to Figure 5.1-2 RCS Layout no impact on RCS design review
 - Add new Table 5.3-8 to support ITAAC RPV acceptable dimension variations (Tier 1 Table 2.2.1-6)

Chapter 8 – Electric Power

Key technical issues

- Bulletin 2012-01 Design Vulnerability in Electric Power System (Byron)
 - AREVA believes the RAI response is acceptable with revised COL Information Item and ITAAC wording
 - COL Information Item 8.2-9 and ITAAC will be revised to require determination of system setpoints to detect open phase condition
- Ongoing Fukushima review has the potential to impact Chapter 8

Chapter 8 open RAIs

- RAI 564 Question 08.02-8 (Byron Bulletin) Supplemental response will address COL Information Item and ITAAC wording
 - NRC Status: In Evaluation. See above.

▶ Other pending FSAR changes

 Minor clarification under consideration in Section 8.3 to fully support ITAAC – no change to technical information

 Supplemental response submitted 3/7/13.

Chapter 17 – Quality Assurance

 - Questions at July FSAR Rev. 5 meeting and PRA audit action regarding finalization of D-RAP list
 - Design changes are reviewed by D-RAP program representative. As necessary, expert panels determine changes to system risk significance.
 - No anticipated changes to D-RAP list.
 - PRA audit action item #5 Add RSS transfer switches to D-RAP table
 - RSS system is identified in D-RAP list risk-significant function as a backup to the MCR
 - U.S. EPR D-RAP list is system-based
 - No change required to Section 17.4
- Actions to achieve closure
 - AREVA
 - Close FSAR Rev 5 mtg and PRA audit action items
 - Submit final FSAR Chapter 17 after closure readiness review
 - NRC
 - Complete SER and schedule ACRS meeting
- Duration for remaining activities



- **Aircraft Impact Assessment** Inspection
- ► AIA inspection conducted 7/22/2013 7/26/2013 and inspection report issued 9/6/2013 with no violations
- AREVA recommends scheduling ACRS meeting in **early 2014**
 - No open items related to AIA Inspection remain



- Previously-identified technical focus areas for the design certification review
- AREVA's DC closure strategy organized around FSAR chapters
 - FSAR chapter closure schedule drives timing of key technical issue resolution
 - However, AREVA will maintain focus on key technical issues that are primary drivers for design certification

 - AREVA has submitted all RAI responses and additional information to support confirmatory calculations. Awaiting confirmation of issue closure.

 - AREVA to supplement response to RAI 553 and GSI-191 technical report markups

- Group A impacts
 - Byron Bulletin Primary impact on Chapter 8
 - Fukushima Risk of impact on Chapter 8, Chapter 10
 - PRA Impact to D-RAP not expected
 - ATWS Secondary impact on Chapter 10
