Concerning the Generic Waste Confidence Rule

Dear NRC:

I am a long-time resident of Charlotte, NC, a member of the Nature Conservancy, and an employee of AREVA. I am writing to express my personal opinion on the generic Waste Confidence Rule currently under discussion.

I urge the NRC to approve the Waste Confidence Rule as soon as possible in its current proposed state (or similar), so that we, as a country, can resume licensing/relicensing clean, safe, carbon-free nuclear power plants such as we are accustomed to here in the Carolinas. As a former Non-Licensed Operator at Duke Energy's McGuire Nuclear Station, I am comfortable with and familiar with the safe handling and storage of spent fuel.
