Subject: Docket Nos. 50-361 and 50-362 San Onofre Nuclear Generating Station Units 2 and 3

License Condition No. (19)d, Procedure for Transients and Accidents, of Operating License No. NPF-10 for San Onofre Unit 2 requires SCE to provide emergency procedure guidelines, consistent with Item I.C.1 of NUREG-0737, to the NRC by May 1, 1982 and to implement emergency procedures, based on guidelines approved by the NRC, prior to the end of the first refueling outage.

Consistent with the May 1, 1982 requirement, draft copies of CEN-152, Revision 01, "Combustion Engineering Emergency Procedure Guidelines, prepared for the Combustion Engineering Owners Group" (CEOG) are being transmitted to Mr. D. L. Ziemann, Chief, Procedures and Test Review Branch of the NRC from Mr. J. Barrow, Chairman, CEOG Operations Subcommittee by letter dated April 30, 1982. The draft of CEN-152, Revision 01 is being provided by the CEOG in order to satisfy the May 1, 1982 requirement of License Condition No. (19)d of Operating License NPF-10 for San Onofre Unit 2 and to appraise the NRC staff of the status of emergency procedure guideline (EPG) development by the CEOG.

It should be noted that SCE is currently participating in the CEOG Operations Subcomittee efforts for the development of EPG's and that the EPG's are still undergoing detailed review and validation. The Operations Subcommittee of the CEOG is aggressively working toward the completion of EPG's which will be acceptable to the NRC. In order to facilitate timely NRC approval, the Operation Subcommittee has met several times with the NRC staff, most recently on March 31, 1982, to discuss status and progress of EPG preparation. Additionally, the Operations Subcommittee workshop recently met on April 21 and 22, 1982 and simulator walk-throughs of selected generic emergency procedures which were prepared consistent with the EPG's were

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conducted at the CE simulator in Windsor, Connecticut on April 10, 17 and 24, 1982 in order to validate the generic procedures. The draft of CEN-152, Revision 01, which is being provided to the NRC by CEOG letter dated April 30, 1982 does not reflect the comments or experience gained from these late developments. Revised EPG's reflecting the results of these developments and future CEOG efforts will be transmitted to the NRC for review and approval by the CEOG on approximately July 1, 1982.
