SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF THE PUBLIC MEETING DISCUSSING THE
ALTERNATIVE SITES SELECTION PROCESS FOR FLORIDA POWER
AND LIGHT'S TURKEY POINT UNITS 6 AND 7 COMBINED LICENSE
APPLICATION

On Tuesday, November 13, 2013, members of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) along with the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers-Miami Field Office (USACE) held a Category 1 public meeting with representatives of Florida Power and Light (FPL) at the Hampton Inn-Homestead in Homestead, FL, regarding the environmental review for Turkey Point Units 6 and 7 combined license (COL). The purpose of the meeting was to discuss and clarify outstanding information required for the alternative sites selection process analysis.

Field Cod

The NRC staff stated based on FPL's responses to requests for additional information (RAIs) 6353 and 6879, provided in letters dated July 8, 2013, the staff was close to moving forward with the alternative sites analysis of the environmental review. The NRC staff also stated if the responses to NRC RAI 7269, issued October 9, 2013, were sufficient the staff could move forward with the alternative sites analysis. FPL indicated the responses to RAI 7269 would be acceptable and submitted to the NRC on November 27, 2013.

The USACE indicated they did not have enough information to move forward with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) or 404(b)(1) Clean Water Act review [least environmentally damaging practicable alternative (LEPDA)] but agreed to work the LEDPA review separately from NEPA for the draft environmental impact statement (EIS). By doing this, the NEPA portion of the review to produce the draft EIS with NRC would be allowed to proceed if FPL provided outstanding additional information needed for USACE to complete its portion of the draft EIS. The USACE requested FPL to submit the following for the NEPA review: more details on the site selection process, and screening criteria used in selecting the sites and the transmission line corridors. FPL agreed to provide the supplemental information to the USACE and follow up with the USACE separately.

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Before the meeting was adjourned, members of the public were invited to ask questions of the NRC staff. Members of the public asked questions regarding the schedule of upcoming environmental review activities and when the draft EIS would be published. In addition, they asked about where the RAIs and responses could be found. Finally, some members of the public asked to be added to the mailing list. Approximately 30 people participated in the meeting. Attendees included members of the public and local/county government officials, representatives of the NRC and its contractor, Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, representatives from the USACE, National Park Service, FPL and its contractors.
