Dear Mr. Jerry W. Haskins,

This is in reference to COL Eckstein's letter dated November 18, 2013, requesting for amendment to Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 28-07946-06, Docket No. 030-21063. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

1. You have requested Mr. Colin F. O'Connor to be your Radiation Safety Officer (RSO) and submitted a training certificate from a radiation safety course that is not a manufacturer or distributor. NUREG-1556, Volume 1, "Consolidated Guidance About Material Licenses, Program-Specific Guidance About Portable Gauge Licenses" Section 8.7 states that the RSO must have adequate training and experience. Successful completion of a fixed gauge manufacturer's or distributor's course or equivalent course that meets Appendix D criteria. Please submit information that the radiation safety course that was attended meets the criteria in Appendix D or other information that demonstrates Mr. O'Connor is qualified through training and experience.
2. Please provide Mr. O'Connor's telephone number, facsimile number, and electronic mail address.
3. Currently the Management Representative Byron L. Young. Do you wish to change the Management Representative? If so, please submit contact information and title of the new management contact.

We will continue our review upon receipt of this information. Please reply to my attention at the Region 1 Office and refer to Mail Control No. 582575. If you have technical questions regarding this letter, please call me at (610) 337-5366.
