Cumulative Effects of Regulation (Case Studies on Regulatory Analyses)

SUMMARY  
On December 20, 2013, Ms. Tara Inverso, of the NRC, and Mr. David Bradish, of the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI), participated in a telephone conversation. The following items were discussed:

- Ms. Inverso provided answers to questions Mr. Bradish asked in a previous phone call. Specifically, Ms. Inverso indicated that the filtered vents and spent fuel expedited transfer regulatory analyses contained a quantitative analysis of benefits. Ms. Inverso also informed Mr. Bradish that the NRC's cost experts were aware of the U.S. Government Accountability Office's (GAO) cost study paper.
- Ms. Inverso and Mr. Bradish discussed plans for an upcoming public meeting to discuss the results of the industry's case studies on regulatory analyses. Ms. Inverso is going to begin scheduling a public meeting during the week of January 27th. The meeting will contain an NEI presentation on lessons learned.
