Purpose

The purpose of this letter is to submit for U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) approval a correction to the previously proposed changes to the Security Program for ATK/ABL, American Centrifuge Program, Rocket Center, West Virginia, ACP-011.

Background

By Reference 1, USEC submitted a request for the review and approval of the Security Program for ATK/ABL (ACP-011), which had be revised to meet the format requirements of the “Standard Practice Procedures Plan Standard Format and Common Set of Requirements for the Protection of Classified Matter for USEC Inc. and Its Limited Liability Companies Regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission.” This submission also included minor changes relating to classification decisions and termination reports.

During a recent NRC inspection of the ATK/ABL facility (November 19 – 20, 2013), a review of ACP-011 revealed that two required sections, Counterintelligence, and Classified Item Inventory

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and Inventory Requirements, had inadvertently been omitted. While these sections are not noted in the “Standard Practice Procedures Plan Standard Format and Common Set of Requirements for the Protection of Classified Matter for USEC Inc. and Its Limited Liability Companies Regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission,” they are required based on a commitment to the guidance in NEI-08-011, Information Security Program Guidelines for Protection of Classified Materials at Uranium Enrichment Facilities. It was determined by the NRC inspection team that although these sections were missing from the revised document, ATK/ABL was still in compliance with the previously approved Security Program document.

On November 20, 2013, USEC committed to providing a corrected document incorporating these missing requirements to the NRC for final review and approval.

Discussion

Enclosure 1 of this letter provides a correction to the previously proposed revision of ACP-011 which has been reformatted to comply with “Standard Practice Procedures Plan Standard Format and Common Set of Requirements for the Protection of Classified Matter for USEC Inc. and Its Limited Liability Companies Regulated by the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission,” which includes the aforementioned missing sections.

Enclosure 1 contains USEC Proprietary Information and Security-Related Information, therefore, USEC requests they be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 *Code of Federal Regulations* 2.390(d)(1). Enclosure 1 has also been determined, in accordance with the guidance provided by the U.S. Department of Energy, to be for Official Use Only.

Action

USEC requests NRC review and approval of the proposed changes to ACP-011 as provided in Enclosure 1 of this letter.
