General Comment

To Whom This May Concern:

There are so many statements casually stated on the storage of nuclear fuel "envisioned" by the NRC. Here are three suggestions as a conscious individual who also lives upon this planet, has no monetary vested interest but only a vested interest in a toxic-free world:

"Generic Address"--One cannot "generically address" the environmental impacts of spent nuclear fuel. One must be precise and far-sighted. A term like "generically address" does not specify future plan and/or historical repercussions on environment due to "spent nuclear fuel". Please be precise, clear, historically-accurate on future plans for environmental impact.

"Licensed life for operation of a reactor"--There is a reason that licenses for operation are granted. To store spent nuclear fuel behind the "licensed life for operation of a reactor" is akin to sweeping dirt under the rug instead of cleaning one's house. This public opinion votes "NO" to storage beyond licensed life.

Please spend any extra energy and defence federal monies on finding a way to neutralize the concentrated toxicity of spent nuclear fuel as well as finding safer ways to utilize existing energy without creating toxic residuals.

Credo states this better than myself, hence:

Make it a national priority to come up with real solutions to long term nuclear waste storage;

- Abandon the generic "one size fits all" approach and instead, make site-specific environmental reports and recommendations;
- Immediately reduce spent fuel pool density to original design standards, without exemptions;
- Accelerate ongoing hardened, on-site storage of spent fuel at all reactor sites.
- Cease production of all nuclear waste.
