INTERVENORS AND NRC STAFF JOINT MOTION FOR CLARIFICATION OF THE
JANUARY 10, 2014 BOARD ORDER MEMORIALIZING POST-HEARING DEADLINES

Pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.323, the Intervenor¹ and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission staff (Staff) request clarification of the Atomic Safety and Licensing Board's (Board's) January 10, 2014 "Order (Memorializing Post-hearing Deadlines)" (Board Order) (ML14010A120).² The stated purpose of the Board Order is to memorialize directions given by the Board during the January 6-8, 2014 evidentiary hearing in Houston, TX. Board Order at 1. However, a portion of the Board Order does not appear to correspond with direction given by the Board during the evidentiary hearing. Specifically, on January 8, 2014, the Board provided ten days for the Intervenor and the Staff to respond to new license conditions offered by NINA in its proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law, while NINA was given five days to reply to the Intervenor's and Staff's responses. See Hearing Tr. at 2561, 2563-64 (Jan. 8, 2014) (ML14013A333). The Board Order, however, provides the Intervenor and the Staff only five days (three working days) to respond to new license conditions proposed by NINA, which is less

than the six days provided to NINA to reply to the Intervenor's and Staff's responses, with NINA already having had an opportunity to argue for its new license conditions in its proposed findings of fact and conclusions of law. See Board Order at 1. The Intervenor and the Staff respectfully request that the Board clarify the briefing dates in the Board Order to provide the Intervenor and the Staff with a ten day response period in accordance with the directions given by the Board during the evidentiary hearing.
