


MITSUBISHI HEAVY INDUSTRIES, LTD.
AFFIDAVIT

I, Yoshiki Ogata, being duly sworn according to law, depose and state as follows:

1. I am Executive Vice President of Mitsubishi Nuclear Energy Systems, Inc., and have been delegated the function of reviewing Mitsubishi Heavy Industries, Ltd.'s (MHI) US-APWR documentation to determine whether it contains information that should be withheld from public disclosure pursuant to 10 C.F.R. § 2.390 (a)(4) as trade secrets and commercial or financial information which is privileged or confidential.
2. In accordance with my responsibilities, I have reviewed the presentation material (DC Slowdown Meeting and DCD Activity Tracking List), dated November 14, 2013, and have determined that the documents contains proprietary information that should be withheld from public disclosure. The documents are identified with the label "Proprietary" on the top of the page.
3. The basis for holding the referenced information confidential is that the presentations identify detail business priorities and budgeting for MHI.
4. The information is not available to any of MHI's competitors due to the financial impacts possible from sharing detail business plans and priorities. Therefore public disclosure of the materials would adversely affect MHI's competitive position.
5. The referenced information has in the past been, and will continue to be, held in confidence by MHI and is always subject to suitable measures to protect it from unauthorized use or disclosure. The referenced information is not available in public sources and could not be gathered readily from other publicly available information.
7. The referenced information is being furnished to the Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) in confidence and solely for the purpose of supporting the NRC staff's review of MHI's application for certification of its US-APWR Standard Plant Design.
8. Public disclosure of the referenced information would assist competitors of MHI. Disclosure of the information identified as proprietary would therefore have the following negative impacts on the competitive position of MHI in the U.S. nuclear plant market.
 - A. Loss of competitive advantage and financial impact due to disclosing business priorities.
 - B. Loss of competitive advantage of the US-APWR created by competitors taking actions based on previously withheld business plans.

I declare under penalty of perjury that the foregoing affidavit and the matters stated therein are true and correct to the best of my knowledge, information, and belief.
