Additionally, please note that as discussed during a telephone conversation on January 21, 2014 with your Chief Operating Officer, Mr. Robert Chasin, the requested correction in the licensee name to remove "PC" does not indicate any new changes in ownership, and as such, the name on the license has been revised to read PriMed, LLC d/b/a Connecticut Heart & Vascular Center.
