This is in reference to your letter dated November 15, 2013, requesting for renewal to Nuclear Regulatory Commission License No. 19-08330-03 and Docket Number 030-06931. In order to continue our review, we need the following additional information:

- 1. Records of our previous inspection indicate that Item 6.A of your current license was in storage awaiting disposal. However, your application lists this item for use of irradiation of material. Please state clearly the status of this item.
- 2. Please describe your procedures for testing the heat and smoke detectors.
- 3. Your emergency procedures did not include the procedures for responding to alarms indicating unauthorized entry into the radiation room and your procedures for responding to natural phenomena like tornados and/or flooding. Please describe your procedures for responding to such events.
