- Current Activities
 - 1 SEIS (Reno Creek)
 - 6 EAs (Smith Ranch, HRI/Crownpoint, Crow Butte LR, North Trend, Ludeman, Marsland)
- Future Activities in FY 14
 - Post-licensing hearing activities
 - Activities for Dewey-Burdock and Ross under Programmatic Agreements
