Contrary to 10 CFR 32.20, on February 1, 2013 and February 1, 2014, the license failed to file summary reports on or before January 31 of each year, indicating the total quantity of each radionuclide transferred under the specific license covering the preceding calendar year.

As corrective action to restore compliance, the licensee committed to file a report covering calendar years 2012 and 2013 no later than April 11, 2014, and to file future reports no later than January 31 of the following year.

PROGRAM SCOPE

This was a re-initial inspection of the exempt distribution license held by American Radiolabeled Chemicals, a manufacturer and distributor of radiolabeled products for life sciences and biomedical research. This license, issued in February 2012, authorizes the distribution of Carbon-14 and Hydrogen-3 in individual quantities not to exceed 50 microcuries to persons exempt from NRC licensing requirements for byproduct material. The licensee originally obtained this license in an effort to broaden the distribution of tritium-labeled shellfish toxins to encourage improved methods of research. At the time of this inspection, the licensee had only distributed one exempt quantity of tritium-labeled saxitoxin under this license. However, the licensee anticipated distributing additional quantities in the coming year, now that a protocol has finally been approved to use the improved methods. The licensee does routinely distribute these radiolabeled toxins to international customers, but requires those customer have a license that specifically authorizes the possession of such material.

PERFORMANCE OBSERVATIONS

The inspector reviewed the licensee's distribution process. The licensee's shipping clerk demonstrated procedures for preparation, labeling and packaging of exempt quantities distributed under this license. The clerk and the RSO for the company's possession license (24-21362-01) demonstrated measures for limiting the spread of contamination and for surveying outgoing packages and the shipping facilities. Both the RSO and the shipping clerk demonstrated an adequate level of understanding of licensee procedures and regulatory requirements.

The inspector reviewed records for the only distribution of material under this license, made in September 2013.

The inspector identified a violation of 10 CFR 32.20 for failure to file a summary report with the NRC for calendar years 2012 or 2013 indicating the total quantity of each radionuclide transferred under the license for each calendar year. The inspector determined that the root cause of the violation was an oversight by licensee staff. As corrective actions, the licensee committed to submit a report indicating the total quantities of material transferred under the exempt distribution license in calendar years 2012 and 2013 no later than April 11, 2014, and to file future reports no later than January 31 of the following year.


