General Comment

Shame on the NRC....The NRC and the industry are abandoning the SNF at the reactor sites, ignoring the responsibility of storing SNF in the safest possible manner and reducing their commitment to provide Emergency Planning. This kind of behavior is not that of a good neighbor to the host communities. Wall Street wants no part of financing nuclear electricity generation projects and the insurance companies want no part of underwriting the risk associated with accidents or liability. These professional risk takers obviously know something about betting on risk, yet the NRC and the industry expect the host communities to take the risk based on hypothetical probabilistic risk assessment....while the professional risk takers won't take the bet. Beyond design basis events happen. It's arrogant to think it can't happen here and not provide Emergency Planning while SNF continues to be stored tentatively at the reactor sites, even after decommissioning.
