

What is a Force-on-Force Exercise?

- A force-on-force inspection is a performance-based inspection that is designed to verify and assess the ability of licensees' physical protective systems and security organizations to provide high assurance that activities involving special nuclear material are not inimical to the common defense and security of the facilities, and do not constitute an unreasonable risk to public health and safety.
- A force-on-force inspection is conducted over several days in two separate visits by an inspection team at the licensee's site.




Force-on-Force inspection Process




Inspection Objectives

- Assess the licensees conduct of the Emergency Preparedness (EP) portion of the FOF inspection, which includes the adequacy of actions to integrate security, plant operations and emergency response, and the licensee's critique process to identify and correct EP weaknesses.




