Dear Mr. Kent:

This refers to your application dated April 11, 2014, and the revised application dated May 1, 2014, for renewal of your NRC license. Enclosed with this letter is the renewed license. **Pursuant to my telephone discussion of May 6, 2014, with Kevin Kalb of your staff, your license now authorizes use of a maximum of 5 portable gauges at your temporary job sites located in NRC jurisdiction. This change does not affect your radioactive materials license from the Commonwealth of Virginia.**

Please review the enclosed document carefully and be sure that you understand all conditions. If there are any errors or questions, please notify the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, Region I Office, Licensing Assistance Team, (610) 337-5239, so that we can provide appropriate corrections and answers.

The NRC expects licensees to conduct their programs with meticulous attention to detail and high standards of safety and compliance. Serious consequences to employees and the public can result from failure to comply with NRC requirements and conditions of the license. Therefore, you must conduct your program according to NRC regulations, the conditions of your NRC license, and the representations made in your application.

You must notify the NRC in writing and request an amendment to your license when your mailing address or the Radiation Safety Officer named on the license changes or you plan to acquire licensed material in excess of the maximum possession limit specified on the license. Authorized location of storage of licensed material is specified in Condition 10 of your license. You are required to request and receive an amendment to your license **prior** to storing licensed material at any location not listed on your license, and prior to releasing for unrestricted use, any of the authorized location(s) of storage.

You will be periodically inspected by the NRC. Failure to conduct your program safely and in accordance with NRC regulations, license conditions, and the representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC will result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation, imposition of a civil

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penalty, or an order suspending, modifying or revoking your license.

An environmental assessment for this action is not required, since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14).
