MEETING OF THE ADVISORY COMMITTEE ON THE MEDICAL USES OF ISOTOPES

May 8-9, 2014

MEETING SUMMARY

PURPOSE

To discuss current rulemaking activities and other issues related to the implementation of the medical regulations in Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 35, and "Medical Use of Byproduct Material."

OUTCOME

The Advisory Committee on the Medical Uses of Isotopes (ACMUI) made recommendations, and the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff gained a better understanding of the views and opinions of the ACMUI, as well as other stakeholders' views and opinions. The staff will consider these views in its continuing effort to make 10 CFR Part 35 more useful, practical, and not overly burdensome on licensees, while maintaining public health and safety.

RECOMMENDATIONS AND ACTIONS

The following recommendations and actions are a result of the discussions that took place on the topics listed on the ACMUI meeting agenda (Attachment 2).

The Committee endorsed the Medical Policy Statement Subcommittee Report. This included a recommendation to make no changes to the current NRC Medical Policy Statement. The recommendation passed unanimously with thirteen favorable votes.

Chairman of the ACMUI, Dr. Thomadsen, formed a subcommittee to review the medical event reporting criteria of the yttrium-90 microspheres (35.1000) guidance. Subcommittee members include: Dr. Guiberteau (chair), Mr. Costello, Dr. Langhorst, Dr. Palestro, Dr. Thomadsen, and Dr. Welsh. The subcommittee will present their recommendations at the fall 2014 meeting. The NRC staff resource is Dr. Howe.

Following the discussion on Medical-Related Events, Dr. Thomadsen added Mr. Francis Costello to the Medical Events Subcommittee.

Following an update on Ga-68 Generators, Dr. Thomadsen formed a subcommittee to provide staff with the background information to justify the recommendation for the regulatory relief from the Decommissioning Funding Plan (DFP) of Ge-68. The subcommittee is specifically charged with evaluating the cost of a DFP for the use of Ge-68, its effect on the future clinical use of new Ga-68 radiopharmaceuticals and how appropriate regulatory relief may be gained. Subcommittee members include Mr. Mattmuller (chair), Dr. Langhorst, Mr. Costello, Dr. Palestro and Dr. Zanzonico. Staff will provide the Ge-68 DFP Subcommittee with the NRC guidelines for developing a Regulatory Basis.

The Committee recommended tabling the discussion on the revisions to the ACMUI Bylaws until summer 2014. The Committee also requested that staff provide the current and proposed bylaws with color coding for staff's proposed changes and the subcommittee's proposed changes. The recommendation passed unanimously with thirteen favorable votes.

Also under the topic of the ACMUI Bylaws, the Committee recommended the following: (1) To maintain the current ACMUI reporting structure and continue to review the reporting structure on an annual basis; (2) To maintain the current two face-to-face meetings at headquarters annually; and (3) To endorse the use of web-based meetings as needed, but not in place of the two annual face-to-face meetings. The recommendation passed unanimously with thirteen favorable votes. This discussion served as the annual discussion on reporting structure for 2014.

The Committee planned to hold the fall 2014 ACMUI Meeting on September 29-30, 2014 at NRC Headquarters. The back-up meeting date is October 20-21, 2014.
