NRC Assigns New Senior Resident Inspector To Pilgrim Nuclear Plant

Nuclear Regulatory Commission officials in King of Prussia, Pa., have selected Erin Carfang as the new Senior Resident Inspector at the Pilgrim nuclear power plant in Plymouth, Mass. She joins NRC Resident Inspector Brian Scrobeck at the site, which is operated by Entergy Nuclear.



Carfang joined the agency's Region I office in 2009. Most recently, she was a Resident Inspector at the Beaver Valley nuclear plant in Shippingport, Pa., and also worked as a reactor inspector in the Region I Division of Reactor Safety. Prior to entering federal service, she served in the U. S. Navy for five years, serving as a naval officer aboard two ships, USS The Sullivans and USS Dwight D. Eisenhower. She has a degree in chemical engineering from Tulane University.

“Erin Carfang has the training, experience and commitment to safety that will help the NRC carry out its mission of protecting people and the environment, and ensure the safe operation of the Pilgrim nuclear plant,” NRC Region I Administrator Bill Dean.

Each U.S. commercial nuclear plant has at least two NRC Resident Inspectors. They serve as the agency's eyes and ears at the facility, conducting inspections, monitoring major work projects and interacting with plant workers and the public. Resident Inspectors can be assigned to any one site for up to seven years.
