MEMORANDUM AND ORDER (Opportunity for Party Comments on Site Visit Report)

In response to the Licensing Board's June 9, 2014 request, applicant Strata Energy, Inc., (SEI) submitted a June 23 report that provides a broad outline for the proposed site visits by the Board and the other parties to SEI's Ross in situ recovery (ISR) facility and the Uranerz Energy Corp. Nichols Ranch ISR site. <u>See</u> [SEI] Report on Site Tours (June 23, 2014) at 1–2 [hereinafter Site Visit Report]; <u>see also</u> Licensing Board Memorandum and Order (Requesting Further Site Visit Information) (June 9, 2014) at 2–3 (unpublished) [hereinafter Board Order]. This includes (1) meeting at the SEI office in Gillette, Wyoming, and using SEI-supplied transportation to reach the Ross and Nichols Ranch ISR sites; (2) touring the sites in SEI-supplied transportation; and (3) returning to Gillette using SEI-supplied transportation via, in the case of the Ross ISR facility tour, Hulett, Wyoming, to view the location, local residences, and Devils Tower. <u>See</u> Site Visit Report, unnumbered attach. 1, at 1 (ASLB Site Visit Schedule and Details). As the Board indicated in its June 9 issuance, the NRC staff and Joint Intervenors¹ will have an opportunity to comment on the SEI report.² See Board Order at 3. Accordingly, the staff and Joint Intervenors may file comments regarding the June 23 SEI site visit report on or before Friday, July 11, 2014.³

³ In this regard, the Board would appreciate any comments the staff might provide regarding the constrains that may exist under the Nuclear Regulatory Commission's ethics rules and guidelines regarding the receipt by agency personnel of SEI-supplied transportation and lunch under the circumstances described in the SEI report.

Also, as the Board indicated in its June 9 issuance, if one or more of the parties believes that efficiency would best be served by having a telephone conference regarding these site visits, at the earliest opportunity they should advise the Board in writing and include several suggested dates/times during which all the parties are available for such a conference. Nonetheless, if either Joint Intervenors or the staff have any questions/objections regarding any aspect of the planned site visits as set forth in SEI's report, the Board would urge that party to contact SEI to afford it an opportunity to address that party's concerns prior to the party providing its comments to the Board.
