EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS EXERCISE
REQUEST FOR EXEMPTION, ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

Gentlemen:

On November 21, 1993, Carolina Power & Light Company (CP&L) requested an exemption from the requirement in 10 CFR 50, Appendix E, Section F.2 in accordance with the provisions of 10 CFR 50.12.

As discussed during a conference call on November 22, 1993, Carolina Power & Light believes that the conduct of an emergency preparedness exercise on November 30, 1993, will not have sufficient staff to meaningfully exercise the Plan due to resource constraints caused by an unscheduled outage to investigate and address core design issues. Personnel are currently being assigned to day and night shift coverage for Operations, Health Physics, Maintenance, Chemistry, Engineering and Administration to support the outage, thereby limiting availability of "players" for an exercise. In addition, three CP&L Investigative Teams have been engaged full time to determine the causes of the core configuration and nuclear instrumentation problems thus further limiting availability of personnel. Key site personnel are involved supporting corrective action efforts, running the outage, startup procedure rewrite, and responding to the needs of the NRC Augmented Inspection Team and CP&L Investigative Teams.

In addition, the State of South Carolina has informed CP&L that the State representative, who would normally be sent to our Emergency Operations Facility, will support a delayed onsite exercise proposed to be conducted in the first quarter of 1994. If the exercise is conducted in late March, the State of South Carolina has also stated that they would support dose assessment activities and would simulate state field teams.

FEMA Region IV Management was consulted by the State of South Carolina on November 19, 1993. This consultation involved a conversation with Mr. John Heard, who was in the hospital at that time.

Finally, note that CP&L maintains the capability to cope with an actual event should it occur. Appropriate augmentation capability will be maintained at all times. Site resources would be refocused to respond to an emergency.
