


**PROGRAM SCOPE**

This was routine inspection of a large mobile service company authorized to use licensed material permitted by Section 35.200 for PET imaging procedures. The licensee operated a scan-in-van mobile service utilizing 15-20 coaches in 23 states. Imaging studies were performed daily at the clients' facilities. The nuclear medicine group was staffed with 80 technologists. The licensee received unit doses from a licensed radiopharmacy. The licensee retained the services of a consulting physicist who served as the corporate RSO. The results of the 2013 annual radiation safety program review was reported on May 6, 2014, with no unusual findings.

This inspection consisted of interviews with licensee personnel and a review of select records. This inspection was limited to the licensee's corporate office. The licensee provided schedules for select field locations to be inspected in the near future. The inspection included in-office review through June 27, 2014, to review the mobile schedules for future inspection efforts.

No violations of NRC requirements were identified during this inspection.
