Dear Mr. Veckman:

This refers to your license amendment request letter dated January 23, 2014, the telephone conversation between you and Scott Wilson of this office on March 10, 2014, and your letter dated March 14, 2014, informing this office that Comprehensive Environmental Assessments, Inc. had undergone an indirect transfer of ownership. Enclosed with this letter is the amended license.

Based on the information you provided, we understand that as a result of an indirect transfer of ownership between yourself and Mr. Kemal Eralp and Mr. Dennis Lynch, control of Comprehensive Environmental Assessments, Inc., was transferred to Mr. Eralp and Mr. Lynch on April 19, 2013. We further understand that this transfer did not result in a change to the licensed name or licensed materials; however, the persons using the license material, the location of use of licensed material and the persons responsible for the radiation safety program did change.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Report, which documents the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the transfer. However, future changes to the ownership of Comprehensive Environmental Assessments, Inc. could result in a transfer of control requiring the consent of the NRC pursuant to 10 CFR 30.34(b).
