Thanks for a productive meeting. I told you I'd send you my list from today so you didn't have to take time to write them down:

- DOE NP2010 lessons learned document – worth a look for items to address in context of possible improvements
- Consider brief discussion of Standard Design Approval & Manufacturing Licenses
- Incorporate ongoing interactions with NEI ITAAC improvement team
- Acceptance review – clarification of what can be done in a 30- or 60-day timeframe; reflect lessons from recent interactions where acceptance review has clearly gone into actual review/RAI space
- Consider discussion on use of DAC
- I agree with previous comments on RAI process – recent discussion in pre-app reviews of mPower has included an emphasis on a more holistic review process - that concept can be folded in here
- Nexus to the notion of “High-quality” – the example Joelle cited is a good one, where there’s an honest difference of opinion about whether something is required to be docketed or even addressed – when the term “high quality” is invoked, it can be pejorative because “quality” (which is a term the industry takes VERY seriously) has been used in the past several years in many cases where level of detail expectations weren’t commonly understood – clarify quality vs. adequacy or level of detail
