Dear: Ms. Doane,

This letter is in response to NRC's request for a deviation from standard codification letter dated June 10, 2014. In that letter, NRC requests that it be allowed to include the popular name and enactment date of its significant authorizing statutes. Research indicates that NRC began using a version of this format in 2012.

The Office of the Federal Register does not object to NRC including popular names of its significant statutory authority or the dates those statutes were enacted in the authority citations of documents published in the *Federal Register* and CFR. Therefore, I grant your request for a deviation to include this information in NCR authority citations provided that they continue to meet the requirements set out in 1 CFR part 21.

This approval for a deviation from the standard CFR formatting style is granted only for the authority citations as discussed above. If you have any questions, please contact our legal staff at 202-741-6030.
