Dear Mr. Stilp:

I am responding to your petition for rulemaking, submitted on August 10, 2011, which was one of fifteen petitions submitted to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) requesting the amendment of Sections 51.45, 51.53, 51.95 and appendix B to subpart A of Part 51 of Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* (10 CFR). Specifically, these fifteen petitions requested that the NRC rescind its regulations that make generic determinations about the environmental impacts of severe reactor accidents and accidents arising from the onsite storage of spent fuel. The NRC docketed these petitions and published a notice of receipt in the *Federal Register* on November 10, 2011 (76 FR 70067).

The fifteen petitions requested that the NRC rescind all regulations in 10 CFR Part 51 that “reach generic conclusions about the environmental impacts of severe reactor and/or spent fuel pool accidents and therefore prohibit considerations of those impacts in reactor licensing proceedings.” This request was premised upon the recommendations of the NRC’s Near-Term Task Force (NTTF) report “Near-Term Task Force Review of Insights from the Fukushima Dai-ichi Accident” (NTTF report). The fifteen petitions asserted that the recommendations of the NTTF report constituted “new and significant” information under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA).

The NRC determined that the fifteen petitions have not provided an adequate basis upon which the NRC could act to amend its regulations as requested. We are, therefore, denying the fifteen petitions. The reasons for the denial are set forth in the enclosed notice to be submitted for publication in the *Federal Register*.
