Discussion: (9/8/14; 13:30 and 15:30) I attempted to contact Ms. Moore concerning the status of the licensed program. An internet search determined that a filing with the bankruptcy court regarding the reorganization had been challenged on September 5<sup>th</sup>. (9/9/14; 09:45) I attempted to contact Ms. Moore and left a voice-mail message for her to contact me. (11:35) Ms. Morrow called me back. I informed Ms. Morrow that the purpose of the phone call was to determine if there was any change in the status of the licensed program since it was noted that the reorganization plan put to the bankruptcy court had been challenged. Ms. Morrow stated that there have not been any changes in the program. She further stated that she was aware of the requirement to notify the NRC once the licensee has exited from bankruptcy. The expected date for exiting from bankruptcy is expected to be October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2014. She inquired whether a separate notification would be required for a name change of the licensee. I informed her that a name change was a license amendment rather than a notification. The information under Change of Control should be consulted so that the NRC could determine if there is a direct or indirect change of control or no change of control at all. If there were any questions, I told Ms. Morrow that she could contact me.

Action Required: Keep track of licensee's progress.
