SUBJECT: LICENSE AMENDMENT

Please find enclosed Amendment Number 24 to NRC License Number 42-23539-01AF approving for unrestricted release of Radioactive Waste Site RW-06 at Kirtland Air Force Base and approval of the associated Final Status Survey Report (FSSR). Enclosed you will find the original "Closure Memorandum for Kirtland Air Force Base, Control No. 576334. In addition, you will find enclosed the original "Understandings Between the United States Air Force and the United States Nuclear Regulatory Commission. Please note that this letter of understanding will be added to license condition 19. An environmental assessment for this licensing action is not required since this action is categorically excluded under 10 CFR 51.22(c)(14). NRC will periodically inspect your radiation safety program in accordance with Manual Chapter 2810, "Master Material License Inspection Program." Failure to conduct your program according to NRC regulations, license conditions, and representations made in your license application and supplemental correspondence with NRC may result in enforcement action against you. This could include issuance of a notice of violation; imposition of a civil penalty; or an order suspending, modifying, or revoking your license as specified in the NRC Enforcement Policy.
