Proactive Disclosure

- Proactive Disclosure takes place when an agency releases non-sensitive information voluntarily and without external prompting
 - 10 CFR 9.21
 - Management Directive 3.4, “Release of Information to the Public”
 - “The NRC staff routinely will make available to the public ... information ... unless the information is exempt from disclosure by statute, Executive Order, or regulation, or not disclosed to the public pursuant to agency policy.”
 - ADAMS contains more than 953,000 publicly available documents.



Sensitive Unclassified Non-Safeguards Information (SUNSI)

- Not eligible for proactive disclosure
- If a record not disclosed under SUNSI is requested under FOIA, a separate analysis for disclosure is conducted



SUNSI Categories

- Allegation Information
- Investigation Information
- Security-Related Information
- Proprietary Information
- Privacy Act/Personally Identifiable Information
- Federal-, State-, Foreign Government-, and International Agency-Controlled Information
- Sensitive Internal Information



Revisiting Documents Not Proactively Disclosed

- Documents are marked as publicly available or not at the time of submission or creation
- Subsequent request under FOIA requires additional review
- Due to the volume, NRC does not automatically re-review SUNSI records
- Many documents previously withheld under SUNSI have been released in whole or part
