New NRC Resident Inspector Assigned to Beaver Valley Nuclear Plant

Nuclear Regulatory Commission officials in King of Prussia, Pa., have selected Brandon Reyes as the new Resident Inspector at the Beaver Valley nuclear plant in Shippingport, Pa. The two-unit site is operated by FirstEnergy Nuclear Operating Company.



“Brandon Reyes has the experience, training and commitment to safety that is needed for the NRC to carry out its mission of protecting people and the environment,” said NRC Acting Region I Administrator David C. Lew.

Reyes joined the NRC’s Region I office as a reactor engineer in 2013. Prior to joining the agency, he was a licensed operator instructor at the Hatch nuclear plant in Baxley, Ga., and a training specialist at the Hanford Tank Waste Treatment and Immobilization Plant in Richland, Wash. He served for seven years in the United States Navy. Reyes received a bachelor’s degree in nuclear engineering technology from Thomas Edison State College and master’s degrees in industrial engineering and business administration from Arizona State University.

Each U.S. commercial nuclear power plant site has at least two NRC Resident Inspectors. They serve as the agency’s eyes and ears at the facility, conducting inspections, monitoring significant work projects, and interacting with plant workers and the public.
