

On behalf of the nuclear energy industry, the Nuclear Energy Institute (NEI)¹ welcomes the opportunity to respond to the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) request for recommendations for updating NUREG-1801 Revision 2, Generic Aging Lessons Learned (GALL) Report, and NURGEG-1801 Revision 2, Standard Review Plan for Review of License Renewal Applications for Nuclear Power Plants, (LR-SRP) to support subsequent license renewal (SLR) activities.
