## Lifetime Mobility in the United States: 2010

According to the 2010 ACS 1-year estimates,

- 45.3 million people lived in a different house within the United States one year earlier.
- Of these movers, 6.7 million lived in a different state.
- The majority of Americans (59 percent) lived in the state in which they were born.
