Mark,

In response to your counsel's question, the NRC's proposed language does not limit the California Coastal Commission in any way. You are correct that the purpose of our proposed language is clarification—we want to identify with more specificity the major actions that the NRC must approve during the decommissioning/license termination process. The specific regulations are 10 CFR 50.82(a)(9)-(10), which concern the licensee's submission of, and the NRC's evaluation and approval of, a license termination plan and 10 CFR 50.83, which concerns the release of part of a nuclear power plant facility prior to the approval of the license termination plan. For further background, 10 CFR 50.82(a)(11), which concerns the actual termination of the license, is essentially a ministerial action.

With respect to language of the NRC listing, I have no objection to the changes indicated in your e-mail below.

Andrew – our counsel asks the obvious question, "does NRC's language limit the Commission in any way?" My sense is no, you were just clarifying the specifics of actions the NRC takes with respect to terminations. We did have one tiny change – use commas rather than semicolon, like so:

"Permits and licenses required for siting and operation of nuclear power plants, approvals of nuclear power plant license termination plans and, prior to the approval of such license termination plans, the approval to release part of a nuclear power plant facility for unrestricted use."

- 8. Department of Transportation Surface Transportation Board (STB):
  - a. Permits for railroad construction (49 U.S.C. § 10901).
  - b. Exemption from service requirements for rail transportation <u>and applications for</u> rail line abandonments (49 USC. §§ 10502, 10903).
  - <u>c</u>b. Removal of trackage and disposition of right-of-way (49 USC. § 10101 et seq.).
