INFORMATION MANAGEMENT STRATEGIC PLAN FOR

FISCAL YEARS 2015 - 2019

The Office of International Programs (OIP) has reviewed the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) Information Technology/Information Management (IT/IM) Strategic Plan for the Fiscal Years 2015 - 2019 and has the following comments and recommendations:

- The strategic plan's "Key Management Objective 2, Information Management and IT," which is to "make authoritative sources accessible anytime, anywhere, and on any device," is too narrow and should be balanced with an equal emphasis on information analysis and reporting. It is also recommended that the IT/IM mission and vision statements be modified accordingly.
- OIP recommends that the Office of Information Services (OIS) create a program to demonstrate the practical application of currently available and proposed new IT/IM technologies to the day-to-day operations of the NRC. These demonstrations should be accompanied by examples of how NRC offices have successfully made use of the technologies.
- OIP recommends the full integration and enablement of the Microsoft Access and SharePoint functions to enable the creation of true web-based databases and that staff be given access to development tools like SharePoint Designer.
