Pursuant to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. 552, I request access to copies of all documents in the power, custody or possession of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission, which drafted since March 11, 2011 to the time of your final response to this request.

Those documents I am seeking are, **limited to Power Point Files** which mentions on the construction, options, design and cost of systems to contain groundwater and radioactive contaminants at the Fukushima Dai-ichi nuclear power plants. Here I do not limit the author of the document to any entity. (They may have been written by USNRC, USDOE, TEPCO, Toshiba, JNRA...etc)

* As you can be easily aware , this request is a narrowly tailored version of a former request Mr. Ian Wilson submitted (<http://pbadupws.nrc.gov/docs/ML1326/ML13262A086.pdf>) . And my purpose for request should not differ from him.

In spite that, the cause which made me submit another request is, an overwhelming volume of Fukushima emergency documents. As a result, prompt access to requesters (including me), and the heavy duty of FOI office are in the level of intolerable.(It's another lesson of Fukushima incident) .

Therefore, now I want to narrow the scope of my request hoping to make a rapid process and access possible, to PPT file's high level summary.

Regarding the prioritization, I would like to ask you process this request while pending all other requests I have submitted, as long as that kind of procedure does not conflict to your inter-agency rule. (I have to admit I do not comprehensively grasp your "on the queue rule".)

The "internal" electronic document which would have been (i.e. past tense) determined as the final version (i.e. most accurate) electronic document having these characteristics (A) details the division of duties and responsibilities of one or more United States governmental entities (i.e. Executive, Judicial, and Legislative branches including their respective subunits) and their individual Commission(s) and advisory bodies (or other designated bodies generally perceived by the public as being comparable to Commissions or advisory bodies), and (B) the hierarchical relationships (i.e. direct and indirect) amongst the bodies identified in (A) above. I am expressly requesting that document which "most completely" meets the requirements of both, (A) and (B) above. As used here, "most completely" details the requested information for the greatest number of governmental entities (e.g. 5 federal departments is "more complete" than 2 federal departments...A document listing all governmental entities is the sought after "most complete" document). This "internal" document may not be in a format for the general public's consumption plus I would expect it to be at a high level (e.g. 30,000 feet) enabling the U.S. President to readily grasp and understand the government he/she is mandated by the United States Constitution to manage and/or cooperate with others. I understand this request may be comprised of one or more electronic documents in lieu of the single document. It is important to note I understand this document would have been considered a baseline from which the Obama administration would begin to implement changes (e.g. phased) throughout President Obama's administration(s). FYI, The President's annual budget or portions thereof which is intended to be presented to Congress does not meet the requirements of this FOIA request and is not the document being requested herein. The President's annual budgets may not even be consistent with the FOIA requested document herein due to a planned "phase-in" of desired changes. These electronic documents may have been prepared by another tax-exempt organization and be retained in the United States government files.

It is important to exercise caution to NOT "nit-pick" this FOIA request as I believe I have been sufficiently detailed enabling a seasoned administrator to understand the scope of my request.
