SUBJECT: SUBMITTAL OF THE SUPPLEMENTAL BIOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT ON THE
RUFIA RED KNOT BIRD FOR THE PROPOSED ENRICO FERMI NUCLEAR
POWER PLANT, UNIT 3

Dear Mr. Hicks:

The U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), as a cooperating agency, completed the final environmental impact statement (EIS) for a combined license (COL) for the Enrico Fermi Nuclear Power Plant, Unit 3, NUREG-2105, "Environmental Impact Statement for Combined License (COL) for Enrico Fermi, Unit 3: Final Report". The EIS included analysis of pertinent environmental matters including those involving endangered or threatened species and impacts to fish and wildlife.

As part of the COL review, the NRC staff prepared a Biological Assessment (BA) that was submitted to the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (FWS) on March 30, 2012. In a letter dated June 8, 2012, the FWS concurred with the NRC's conclusions that no impact to threatened or endangered species is expected to result from the COL activities. Since the issuance of the 2012 BA, the rufa red knot bird was listed as a threatened species in December 2014. The NRC and the USACE have prepared a supplemental BA to update the 2012 BA. The purpose of this letter is to provide a copy of the supplemental BA for your review.

The Fermi site is located on approximately 1,260 acres along the western shore of Lake Erie. The Fermi site currently has one operating boiling water reactor, Fermi Nuclear Power Reactor Unit 2 (Fermi 2), which has the capacity to generate 1,089 megawatts of electricity. In addition, there is one non-operating reactor, Enrico Fermi Nuclear Power Plant Unit 1, which has been defueled and is in the process of being decommissioned. DTE Energy Co. (DTE) proposes to construct one new nuclear unit adjacent to the existing facilities in areas that have been previously disturbed. Certain USACE regulated activities and structures associated with the project would occur in waters of the United States and adjacent wetlands.
