
By letter dated December 9, 2014, Prime Healthcare Services, Inc. (Prime), on behalf of Carondelet Health, Inc. (Carondelet), submitted to the U. S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) a Request for Consent to Indirect License Transfer of NRC Materials Licenses No. 24-02704-01, 24-20274-01, and 24-32245-01. Based on the information provided, we understand that as a result of a purchase agreement between Prime and Carondelet, control of St. Joseph Health Center (License No. 24-02704-01), St. Mary's Medical Center (License No. 24-20274-01), and Carondelet Cardiology Services (License No. 24-32245-01), will be indirectly transferred to Prime. We further understand that this transfer will not result in any change to the licensed material, persons using the licensed material, locations of use of licensed material, or persons responsible for the licensee's radiation safety program.

Based on the above understandings and as more fully detailed in the enclosed NRC staff's Safety Evaluation Reports which document the NRC staff's review of the request, we have no objection to the transfers. It is our understanding that the effective date of the transfers will be on February 13, 2015. **Please note that you will need to notify us within 30 days, in writing, after the transaction has been finalized and include a signed copy of the purchase agreement confirming completion of the transaction.** Also, please include information to support other necessary changes such as facility name changes. With this information, we can issue amendments to the aforementioned NRC licenses to reflect the transaction, if necessary.
