In order to continue the review of your application for an NRC license to use radioactive materials, we need additional information. If you have any questions, please contact me (610-337-5089).

1. On page 5 of your application, you indicate that one of your americium-241 plated foils is a QSA Global, Inc. Model No. AMM.100H. However, on your current license you are authorized for a QSA Global, Inc. Model No. AMM.1001H. Is this a typographical error? If you are actually requesting a QSA Global, Inc. Model AMM.100H americium-241 source, please provide the Sealed Source and Device Registry No. because I was not able to locate this source in the NRC registry.

2. It appears that one of your locations of authorized use and storage may have changed. In Condition 10. of your present license you are authorized to use and store radioactive material at "4790 Rucker Boulevard, Enterprise, AL". In your renewal application you have requested Fort Rucker CSSA, 1326 Quartermaster Road, Fort Rucker, AL. Are these the same location with a different descriptor? If you have moved your location of use and storage, please describe the steps you have taken to assure that the facility at 4790 Rucker Boulevard, Enterprise, AL is releasable for unrestricted use. Describe how you verified that all radioactive material was removed from the facility and no contamination remained.

Please respond in writing with a signed letter. You may submit the signed response document by hard copy, or as a pdf copy attached to an email, or by facsimile to 610-337-5269. Please be sure to include the Control No. 585445 on your response. We would appreciate a response within 30 days in order to expedite review of the license.

Please find the additional information requested:

NRC Request #1: On page 5 of your application, you indicate that one of your americium-241 plated foils is a QSA Global, Inc. Model No. AMM.100H. However, on your current license you are authorized for a QSA Global, Inc. Model No. AMM.1001H. Is this a typographical error? If you are actually requesting a QSA Global, Inc. Model AMM.100H americium-241 source, please provide the Sealed Source and Device Registry No. because I was not able to locate this source in the NRC registry.

LMC Response #1: Lockheed Martin Missiles and Fire Control (LMMFC) is requesting to authorization to use, possess, handle, store, ship, *et al* QSA Global, Inc. Model No. AMM.1001H. LMMFC's renewal contained a typographical error.


NRC Request #2: It appears that one of your locations of authorized use and storage may have changed. In Condition 10 of your present license you are authorized to use and store radioactive material at "4790 Rucker Boulevard, Enterprise, AL". In your renewal application you have requested Fort Rucker CSSA, 1326 Quartermaster Road, Fort Rucker, AL. Are these the same location with a different descriptor? If you have moved your location of use and storage, please describe the steps you have taken to assure that the facility at 4790 Rucker Boulevard, Enterprise, AL is releasable for unrestricted use. Describe how you verified that all radioactive material was removed from the facility and no contamination remained.

LMC Response #2: This is the same facility. On our application dated June 25, 2013, when LMMFC requested the addition of the Ft. Rucker facility, LMMFC inadvertently provided the wrong address description. The correct address is Fort Rucker CSSA, 1326 Quartermaster Road, Fort Rucker, AL. LMMFC has not moved its location of use and storage. Therefore, there was no need to assure that the facility is releasable for unrestricted use; nor was there a need to verify that all radioactive material was removed from the facility and that no contamination remained.
