Response:

The 2010 Region I IMPEP report included no comments or recommendations. The report from the Periodic Meeting in February 2013, indicated performance was satisfactory with no performance concerns or issues. However, attendees discussed the Division's program for incident response including the completeness and timeliness of NMED reporting. FSME staff provided to the Division a list of records dating back to 2011 categorized in NMED as "not complete" or "request for additional information." The Division committed to investigating these cases and supplying what is needed for closure, but requested assistance with some type of "tickler" report from the NMED contractor or inclusion of these cases in the quarterly operating plan data issued by FSME, for better management oversight of these cases to completion. FSME staff took this item for additional consideration. Additionally, Region I has closed all of the NMED reports where follow-up actions have been completed.

Annual self-assessments have been completed (last one completed in September 2014) and all have concluded that the region continues to implement an effective materials program at a consistently high level of performance. The most recent self-assessment report documents 3 findings and 10 observations. The self-assessment can be found in ADAMS under Accession No. [REDACTED]. Recommended actions to address the observations were tracked using the DNMS Action Item List.

**Monica Ford** – Although not required for her current position, Ms. Ford is completing the IMC 1248 license reviewer and or materials inspector qualifications. Ms. Ford is tentatively scheduled to complete the qualifications in FY 2016.

Region I implemented use of the IMC 1248 guidance for qualification and training requirements in April of 2013. Prior to that time, Region I implemented the IMC 1246 guidance. In addition, Region I implements and maintains Region I, DNMS Directive 0400/1, "DNMS Training and Qualification Program."

Response:

DNMS is currently in the process of filling one vacancy in the Decommissioning and Technical Support Branch (Branch 3) with an incumbent from DRP. The selectee will transition to her new position in May 2015.

After reviewing the current and future budget and resource needs of DNMS, the decision was made to "hire ahead" for two positions in anticipation of future losses within the division. These positions will allow new staff to complete a substantial portion of the qualification program before the anticipated retirements occur. Management is currently reviewing applications and will schedule interviews for the two "hire ahead" positions.

Based on current budget predictions for fiscal years 2016 and 2017, DNMS staffing levels will approximately remain the same as current staffing levels. DNMS management continues to assess budget and resource needs and make pro-active hiring decisions.

Response:

DNMS maintained a sufficient number of portable instruments calibrated and available for use by inspection staff during the review period. Semi-annual inventories are performed to monitor instrument status and assure operability for inspection needs. A designated DNMS supply room with limited access by staff is used for instrument storage. There is a separate supply of instruments designated for use in the event of emergencies. A DNMS Health Physicist has responsibility for assuring instrument calibration and inventory control. Repair and calibration of portable instrumentation is performed under service contract by RSCS in Stratham, New Hampshire, or by the manufacturer.

Region I has no in-house laboratory capability. Samples collected in the field are sent to Oak Ridge Institute for Science and Education for analysis.

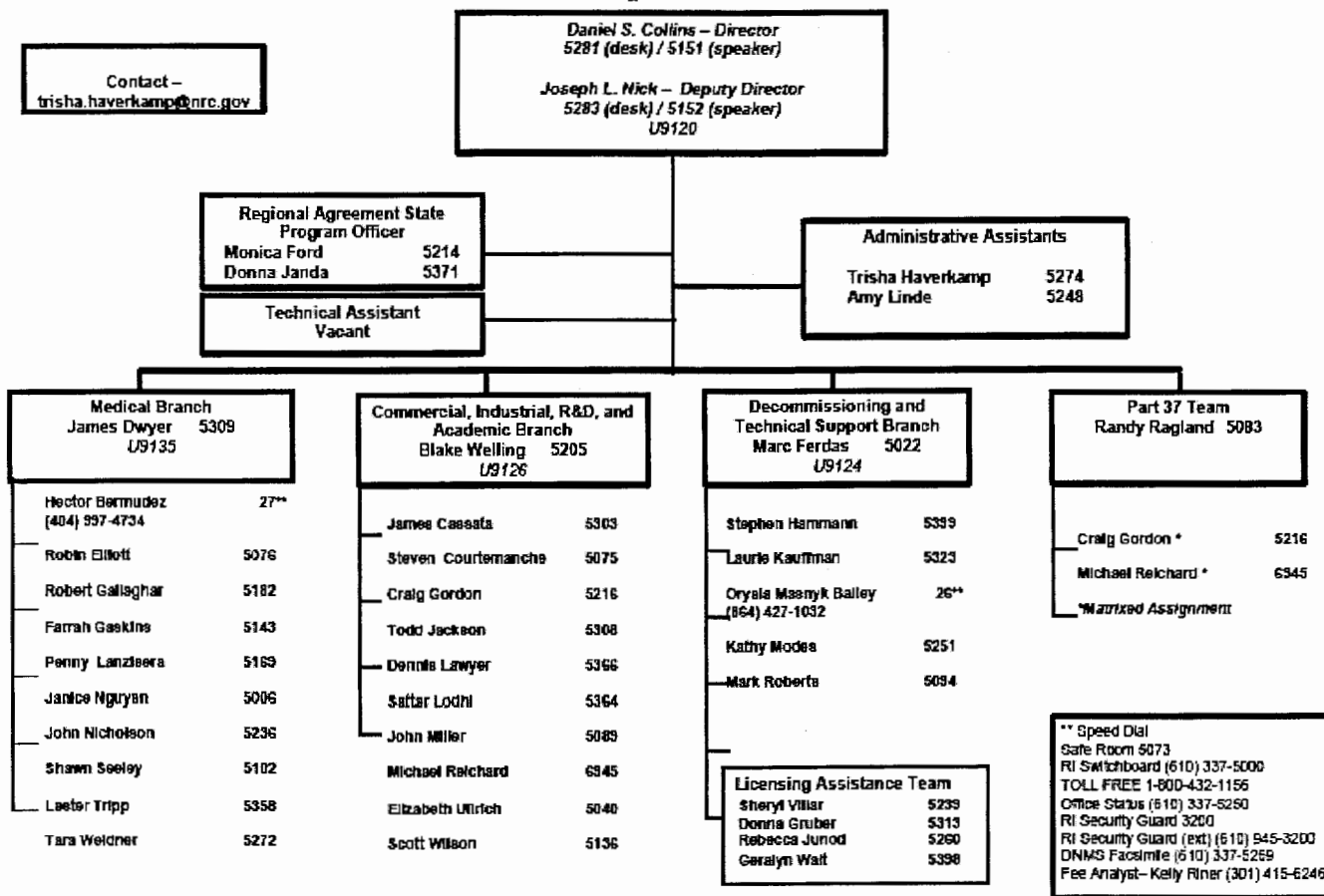
