Nate,

Exhibit 1.1-4 of the response to the request for additional information dated July 8, 2014 shows the anticipated fenced area on BLM surface. The anticipated fenced area is 27.1 acres. This is associated with portions of potential Burdock well fields B-WF1, B-WF2, B-WF3 and B-WF4. These areas would not be fenced for the entire life of the project, but would be fenced beginning when the associated well fields are constructed and through decommissioning of these well fields, which will occur after regulatory approval of successful groundwater restoration of these well fields.
