Dear Mr. Vargo:

On January 30-31, 2015, Scott Wilson of this office conducted an inspection at the office of Dominion NDT Services, Inc. (Dominion) located at 2204 Commerce Road, Richmond, Virginia, and at the Craney Island Naval Fuel Depot in Portsmouth, Virginia of activities authorized by the above listed NRC license. The inspection continued in-office until March 30, 2015. The inspection was an examination of your licensed activities as they relate to radiation safety and to compliance with the Commission's regulations and the license conditions. The findings of the inspection were discussed with you and Norman Boggs, Radiation Safety Officer of your organization, via telephone at the conclusion of the inspection on March 30, 2015.

Based on the results of this inspection, the NRC determined that one or more violations of NRC requirements occurred. Because of the security-related nature of any such violations, the number and characterization will not be provided in this letter, but instead are provided in non-public enclosures. The violation(s) were evaluated in accordance with the NRC Enforcement Policy. The violation(s) is/are cited in the Notice of Violation (Notice), provided as Enclosure 1 to this letter. The violation(s) is/are cited because the violation(s) was/were identified by NRC. Enclosure 2 provides a determination of severity level and a description of the corrective actions taken by Dominion NDT Services, Inc. to address any violation(s).

The NRC has concluded that information regarding the reason for the violation(s), the corrective actions taken and planned to correct the violation(s) and prevent recurrence is already adequately addressed in our records. Therefore, you are not required to respond to this letter unless the description of your corrective actions in Enclosure 2 does not accurately reflect your corrective actions or your position. In that case, or if you choose to provide additional information, you should follow the instructions specified in the enclosed Notice.
