RE: Reply to a Notice of Violation

Gentlemen/Ladies:

NRC Violation 1 – Brayman Construction did not submit an amendment to the license naming a replacement RSO.

BCC Response 1 – Brayman Construction submitted a letter to the NRC, dated April 16, 2015, requesting a license amendment that will have Stephen Rihel replace Jeremy Walls as the RSO.

NRC Violation 2 – Brayman Construction did not conduct a physical inventory to account for all sources and/or devices received and possessed under the license (specifically the Thermo Measure Tech).

BCC Response 2 – The Thermo Measure Tech gauge was added to the physical inventory record and site personnel will verify that an accounting of all devices in their possession is made. This was completed on December 19, 2014 and will continue every 6 months per the license requirements.

NRC Violation 3 – Brayman Construction did not log the gauge into the daily use log when the gauge was returned to storage.


BCC Response 3 – The corporate safety director will conduct training to all personnel about their responsibility to completely fill out the daily use log when removing devices from storage

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and when returning the devices to the storage room. The site safety officer will review the daily use log on a periodic basis to ensure that devices are signed back in.
